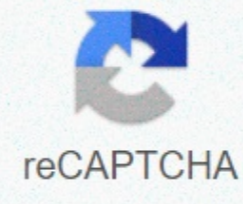

ANTIBIOTICS Up to a 14-day supply of the following generic oral antibiotics for free: Amoxicillin, Ampicillin, Cephalexin (capsules and suspension only), Sulfamethoxazole/Trimethoprim (SMZ-TMP), Ciprofloxacin (excluding Ciprofloxacin XR), Penicillin VK, Doxycycline Hyclate (capsules only). You can get FREE Metformin (90 tablets of generic metformin with immediate release – 500mg, 850 mg, and 1000 mg). ACE inhibitor, lisinopril is used to prevent, treat or improve symptoms of high blood pressure, certain heart disease, diabetes and certain chronic kidney conditions. Get a 30-day supply of free lisinopril only at a Publix pharmacy. (Maximum 30 days supply (up to 60 tablets). Lisinopril-HCTZ combined products excluded.) Combined amlodipine products are excluded.
